- Cared for receiving care visits at varying times. Early i.e. tea and bedtime calls in early evening.

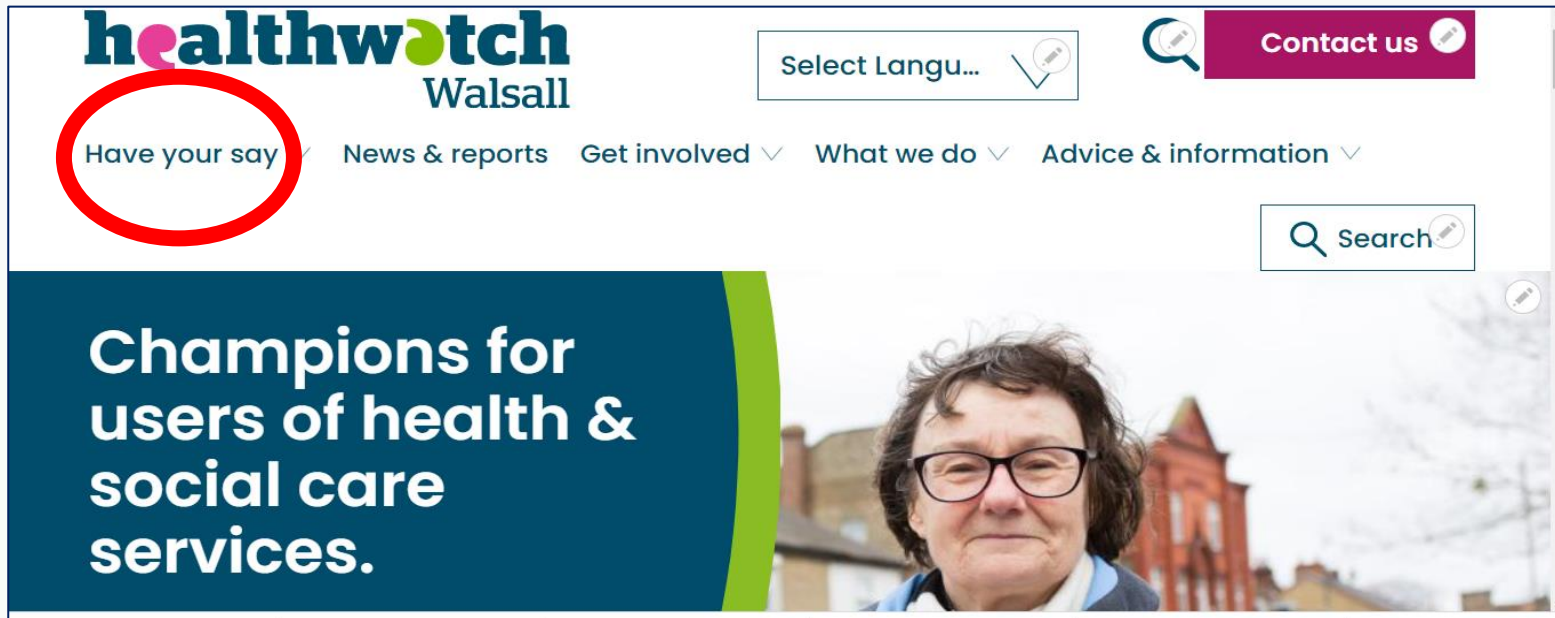
